
LISA HERMAN EQUESTRIAN DIRECTOR



In our Pottery Studio, campers are given the opportunity to practice different types of techniques with clay such as glazing, sculpting, throwing on the wheel and hand building.



AGE GROUPS AND CABINS

We have more than one counselor for every three campers. Camp Rim Rock has six units with several cabins in each unit. Each unit operates like its own small camp. There are at least two counselors living in each cabin with the girls. The camp divides its campers into groups by their grade and age. Each unit has its own bath house with private showers, sinks and modern plumbing. We pride ourselves on the high return rate of our campers. We have many girls who have spent more than ten summers at Camp Rim Rock.

SESSION INFORMATION

There are three 2-week General Camp sessions that may be combined into 4 or 6 week sessions. In addition, there are 2 1-week Horseback Riding Specialty sessions and a Mini Camp session. Many girls create a 3 or 5 week session by adding a week of Riding Camp to General Camp sessions.

Letters are preferable to emails, faxes and packages. Candy, snacks and other food are against camp policy. Books, magazines and other items that can be shared with your daughter's bunkmates are preferred. If you send packages, please make them small in size.

Phone calls at camp are disruptive to your daughter's schedule as well as to her ability to adjust to camp. To inquire as to how your daughter is doing, please call our office at 347-RIM-ROCK and a Program Director or a counselor will return your call. We do allow a phone call for campers staying three or more weeks after the first two weeks.

VISITING

Camp helps your daughter develop self confidence. She needs to be wholeheartedly involved in what is going on at camp. Visits from home can disrupt this process. Therefore, we do not have a visiting day. If your daughter is staying for multiple sessions, arrangements can be made for a visit on the Saturday between sessions.

PACKING LIST

The packing list is on our website. We ask campers not to bring valuable items. Cell phones are prohibited.

Camp Rim Rock's clothing suggestions have been made as simple and sensible as possible. Each article should be plainly marked with your daughters full name. Clothing is most easily kept in a trunk which can slide under the bed.

Laundry is done once during a two week session. Remember to mark everything. Do not bring clothing that requires special handling.

TUITION

The tuition covers:

The tuition does not include West Virginia sales tax, medical insurance, riding helmet or transportation between camp and the airport. It is against our policy for counselors to receive gratuities.

A \$500 deposit per session, which is applied to tuition, is required upon enrollment. \$250 of this amount is a nonrefundable registration fee. Tuition payment, other than the \$250 registration fee, is refunded if cancellation is made prior to April 1. An additional \$500 payment per session is due February 1. The balance is due April 1.

BIRTHDAYS

Many campers celebrate their birthday while at camp. We recognize her special day with a happy birthday from the entire camp, "bumps" and a birthday cake to be shared with her unit.

FOOD GLORIOUS FOOD

We do our very best to make sure that our campers enjoy their meals. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are served "family style" in our Dining Hall. Our campers and counselors sit together to eat and socialize during meals. In addition to the meal that is served, we have "side tables" filled with options. We serve foods that are familiar - everything from a daily salad bar to Taco Tuesday - and also encourage a camper to try something new. Our counselors are there to assist and keep a watchful eye. Morning snacks, evening campfires with s'mores and other goodies, occasionally a baking class all add to the fun! Nothing makes us happier than when a parent asks us for our "secret" recipe.

BENEFITS OF CAMP

Dr Wendy Mogel is a nationally-known clinical psychologist and educator who wrote the best-seller parenting book "The Blessing of a Skinned Knee". She shared a story about a good friend of hers whose daughter was a freshman at college.

This woman's daughter thrived in her first semester in college. She earned exceptional marks (making the Dean's List) and she became president of the freshman class. During Parents weekend, her mother met the mother of a senior who was president of the entire student body and was weighing various job offers. The two mothers were sharing stories about their daughter's college experience when the mother of the senior shared an unexpected thought: "I bet your daughter went to overnight summer camp."

- Camp helps students adjust to being away-from-home by giving them practice being away-from-home.
- Camp enables children to experience successful independence. Like college, they are away-from-home. Unlike college, they are in a community committed to their physical and emotional safety.
- Camp also helps campers deal with uncertainty. The camper who comes to camp for several years gets multiple opportunities to strengthen his or her resilience muscle. By the time they go to college, they are much more confident and resilient.
